Subject: First Intergovernmental Session of the IOC Sub-Commission for the Central Indian Ocean (IOCINDIO-1), 21–23 May 2025, and IOCINDIO Workshop on Strengthening Ocean Sustainability, 19–20 May 2025, at Emirate of Ras Al Khaimah, United Arab Emirates

The IOC Assembly at its 32nd session (2023) through <u>Resolution A-32/1</u> decided to establish IOC Sub-Commission for the Central Indian Ocean (IOCINDIO) as an intergovernmental body to foster regional cooperation in ocean sciences, building on three decades of work of the IOCINDIO Regional Committee.

As a response to IOC Circular Letter No <u>2956</u> (dated 24 August 2023) inviting Member States to formally join the IOCINDIO Sub-Commission, a total of 11 (eleven) Letters of Adhesion have been received by the IOC Executive Secretary from competent national focal points of IOC Member States, namely Bangladesh, France, India, Islamic Republic of Iran, Kuwait, Oman, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, United Arab Emirates, and the United States of America – hence establishing IOCINDIO as a sub-commission.

Other IOC Members States still wishing to join the IOCINDIO Sub-Commission and attend the first session of the sub-commission are encouraged to do so by sending a letter to the IOC Secretariat at the earliest opportunity. Membership to IOC regional bodies aims to strengthen cooperation amongst Member States and entails no financial obligations, other than voluntary participation in cooperation programmes and projects developed within the framework of IOCINDIO. The national focal points for IOCINDIO Member States will be the same as those for the IOC.

As a statutory meeting, the session will bring together national competent governmental agencies for ocean, marine scientific communities and other relevant ocean stakeholders in the region, to foster ocean science-policy interface, advance ocean science development and cooperation, enhance technical and institutional capacities, promote transfer of ocean technology, and jointly develop ocean science solutions to sustainable development in the region.

IOCINDIO as an IOC Regional Committee will be dissolved at IOCINDIO-1. In order to ensure smooth transition and running of the meeting, it is proposed that the current Chair of the IOCINDIO Committee will Chair the IOCINDIO-1 Session with the understanding that a Board of Officers of the Sub-Commission comprising a Chair and two Vice-Chairs will be elected by IOCINDIO Member States at the end of the session, for the next 2-year intersessional period. Elected Officers may be re-elected for one additional term of office. Information about the election procedure and prescribed nomination forms are attached hereafter as Annex 4. Note that nominations should be sent to Dr Nimit Kumar, IOCINDIO Technical Secretary at nd.joshi@unesco.org, no later than 21 May 2025 at 19:00 (UAE time, UTC+0400).

The main discussions on the provisional agenda in the annex are: reviewing IOCINDIO activities and priorities in alignment with IOC strategic programmatic development, advancing the implementation of the UN Decade of Ocean Sciences for Sustainable Development, strengthening cooperation with IOC sub-commissions as well as other regional UN and non-UN frameworks. The documentation for the session and the information note for participants, including venue details, prepared by the organizing committee of the host will be posted online at https://oceanexpert.org/event/4703.

With a view to enhance regional cooperation, we also invite participation from observer entities from UN and recognized non-UN regional frameworks. This will facilitate seeking synergies as well as facilitating extrabudgetary funding towards addressing regional priorities.

The IOCINDIO session will be preceded by a Regional Workshop on 19–20 May 2025, which aimed at strengthening understanding of regional thematic areas, and establishing collaborations, notably in the UN Ocean Decade context. Delegates also wishing to take part in the preceding workshop are invited to identify themselves at the same time and register online at the webpage for the workshop (<u>https://oceanexpert.org/event/4702</u>) by 25 April 2025. Limited funding is available on request to support the participation of national experts in the Workshop. The presence of representatives from Member States and non-State experts will ensure successful proceedings of the workshop. The recommendations emerging from the workshop will feed the discussion of the IOCINDIO plenary meeting. The IOCINDIO-1 report will then be presented to the next IOC assembly in June.

Elections of the Officers of the IOCINDIO sub-commission

The IOC Sub-Commission for the Central Indian Ocean at its first session (IOCINDIO-1) shall elect one Chairperson and two Vice-Chairpersons, for the term until the second session of IOCINDIO.

The Chairperson shall preside over the sessions of the Sub-Commission and carry out the duties which are entrusted to him/her. The Vice-Chairpersons assist the Chairperson in his/her functions and substitute him/her where necessary. The Vice-chairpersons will be entrusted with specific responsibilities.

The Chairperson and the Vice-Chairpersons of an IOC Subsidiary Body shall not remain in his/her mandate for more than two successive terms, according to the <u>IOC Rules of Procedure</u>.

Nominations

Nominations of individuals to either the post of Chairperson or the posts of Vice-Chairpersons shall be submitted by Member States through the officially designated Head of Delegation to the IOCINDIO-1 or through the <u>IOC Focal Point in the Member State or the Permanent Delegation to UNESCO</u>.

Nominations shall be submitted in writing to the Executive Secretary using **Form A** (Chairperson) or **Form B** (Vice-chairperson). They must reach the Executive Secretary or his representative by the specified deadline for nomination (as indicated in this invitation letter).

Each nomination shall contain a declaration from the candidate that he/she is prepared to stand for the post for which he/she has been nominated and is willing to take on the obligations that would devolve upon him/her, should he/she be elected. Each nomination shall also contain a CV with the profile of the candidate (**Form C**).

Each candidate must be seconded by two Member States of IOCINDIO other than the nominating Member State.

Elections

The IOC general practice is working and deciding by consensus (<u>Rule</u> 19.2).

Should voting be necessary, decisions shall be made by a simple majority of the members present and voting (Technical arrangements 2.20(iv)), by secret ballot.
