- 2. IOC Secretariat also pleased to discuss other forms of support including preparatory meetings.
- 3. Submitters encouraged to discuss with other submitters as may be relevant and useful. Focal point names will be shared after meeting.
- 4. Full proposals due before 25 April 2025
- 5. IOC Executive Secretary in consultation with the IOC Chair and Officers will review submissions with IOC Chair and Officers.
- 6. Final decision announced at the 33rd IOC Assembly in **June 2025** (with pre-announcement to all 4 submitters)

DRAFT SCOPING FRAMEWORK FOR OCEAN DECADE MID-TERM EVALUATION

Summary

With reference to the UN General Assembly \(\text{NRES/T2/73}\), which proclaimed the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development 2021–2030, the year 2025 marks the mid-point in the implementation of the Ocean Decade under the coordination of UNESCO-IOC and the launch of a mid-term evaluation process.

This document outlines the proposed scope, modalities, and timing of the mid-term evaluation process. Following discussions at the Executive Council it will be used to develop the detailed Terms of Reference of the evaluation, the results of which will be presented at the next IOC Assembly.

<u>Financial and administrative implications</u>: The evaluation will be funded through UNESCO's Internal Oversight Service.

The proposed decision is referenced as Draft Resolution EC-57/[4.7] in the Action Paper (document IOC/EC-57/AP Prov. Rev.)



Draft scoping framework for mid-term evaluation presented to IOC Executive Council in June 2024, as in Dec 4.7:

10. ...develop the detailed Terms of Reference of the Evaluation...;
11. Requests the UNESCO Internal Oversight Service to carry out the Evaluation...and to present the results to the IOC Assembly at its 33rd session



Evaluation purpose: an <u>independent</u> evaluation to:

"...review the structures, processes, partnerships, and resources that underpin the delivery of the Ocean Decade and make recommendations to optimise the impact of the Ocean Decade."

"...explore both causes and solutions to issues that are identified as hindering implementation and delivery of the Decade..."

Mid-Term Evaluation Findings & Recommendations

- 1. Streamline and strengthen the governance and coordination framework for the Ocean Decade to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of implementation and support progress toward its intended outcomes in the second half.
- 2. Strengthen UN system-wide collaboration and alignment to support the achievement of the Decade's outcomes and reinforce its identity as a collective UN initiative, enhancing its global reach and impact.
- 3. Put in place a comprehensive resource mobilization framework to ensure sustainable funding for the coordination of the Decadeand to strengthen the enabling environment for funding and supporting Decade Actions.
- 4. Strengthen national and regional engagement, with a focus on LDCs, SIDS and other under-represented regions, to facilitate more equitable participation and alignment with local and regional priorities.
- 5. Enhance the mainstreaming of inclusivity, diversity, and equity to ensure that all voices, particularly those of marginalized and under-represented groups, are meaningfully included and benefit from the Decade.
- 6. Strengthen the strategic focus and impact of the UN Ocean Decade Actions to enhance alignment with global and national priorties, promote innovation, support knowledge use and ensure practical application for tangible benefits to Member States and the ecosystem.
- 7. Enhance the existing monitoring and evaluation (M&E) framework to transform it into a monitoring, evaluation and learning (ME) system.
- Systematically leverage the Decade to shape UNESCO-IOC's post-2030 agenda and amplify the impact of its programmes.

IOC ROLE & PRIORITIES

Our role at 2025 UNOC is to advance ocean science and knowledge as a basis for action to achieve SDG 14 & the 2030 Agenda in line with our mandate & strategic priorities.

Our engagement will generate action and partnerships to create sustained impact to:

- a. Fulfil critical knowledge priorities through the Ocean Decade as identified in The Barcelona Statement.
- b. Increase sustained investment in ocean science activities and infrastructure for observations and data.
- c. Accelerate sustainable ocean plans including support to Member States to develop and implement SOPs.
- d. Generate data, knowledge and capacity to support implementation of commitments under BBNJ and GBF
- e. Ensure collaborative action for disaster risk reduction and preparedness in the face of ocean hazards
- f. Accelerate efforts for 2030 goal for seabed mapping by unlocking existing data and generating new data.


